

## Reggio Parma Festival 2023 - DANCE MAGUY MARIN

## La Passione dei Possibili Parma | Reggio Emilia

May - December 2023

Dedicated to Maguy Marin, the French choreographer winner of the Golden Lion at the Venice Biennale, the project Maguy Marin - La Passione dei Possibili (The Passion of Possible) created by the Reggio Parma Festival runs from May to December 2023 at the Teatro Regio and the Teatro Due in Parma, and at the Teatro Municipale Valli, Teatro Ariosto and Teatro Cavallerizza in Reggio Emilia. With the patronage of the French Embassy in Italy, this programme of performances and initiatives introduces to large audiences the works of one of the most eclectic and brave choreographers and artists on the international scene, interpreter of the complexity of contemporary human beings and their contradictions through dance, the body and space.

The daughter of Spanish immigrants fleeing Franco's dictatorship, Maguy Marin has been active since 1976 and chameleon-like in her research of movement. The artist has defined her own original stylistic signature: in her creations, dance is imbued with a marked theatricality. If the scenes or characters are often comical, the general tone is apocalyptic and the spectator is always caught between a smile, amazement and apprehension. Audacious and combative, the choreographer has been able to follow and artistically translate the upheavals of our time without holding back joyful and furious punches on the face of barbarity. Maguy Marin has inserted inside her creations a renewal of 'this something that is dance', while always keeping before her all the possibilities that dance itself has at its disposal.

The project stems from the will of the **Reggio Parma Festival and all its members** - the Municipality of Parma, the Municipality of Reggio Emilia, the I Teatri Foundation of Reggio Emilia, the Teatro Due Foundation and the Teatro Regio Foundation of Parma - to work together for the creation of an ambitious project in 2023. A programme ranging from dance to music to theatre, and where Maguy Marin is one of the first and main protagonists. Indeed, the Reggio Parma Festival is coproducer of her new performance and pays an important tribute throughout the year to her and her production.

A journey loaded with emotions that kicks off at the Teatro Regio in Parma on 31 May with a performance of May B, Maguy Marin's timeless masterpiece with over 750 performances on five continents. A work conceived in 1981, part of the company's repertoire for over 40 years, and inspired by the tragicomic world and salvific cynicism of Irish playwright Samuel Beckett. On its debut, it shattered all thoughts about dance, it was an explosion that has not stopped resonating. Ahead of the performance, the documentary Maguy Marin - L'urgence d'agir by director David Mambouch will be screened (30 May at 6 p.m. - Sala degli Specchi, Teatro Municipale Valli, Regaio Emilia). It centred on the story of the play "May B" and the experience of the protagonists who interpreted it. A meeting with the choreographer will follow.



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In the fall, the project will take off with a programme full of cult shows and the Italian debut of the French artist's latest work.


**Singspiele** (14 e 15 November, Teatro Due, Parma) is a 2014 performance, interpreted by David Mambouch with set design by Benjamin Lebreton. With the many uses of the body and gesture research, this performance expresses the French choreographer's highest experimental essence and goes beyond the boundaries of dance itself. Focusing on faces, either anonymous or recognisable, that attract our gaze, **Singspiele** is a listening piece of what the people tell us about their absent bodies. The story that we can read on their mute faces shall always escape us because comprehensible in the immediate present.

The Italian debut of the *new creation*, whose title will be revealed shortly, is scheduled for 18 and 19 November at the Teatro Cavallerizza of Reggio Emilia, during the Festival Aperto. In this performance, co-produced by the Reggio Parma Festival, Maguy Marin wonders about current issues, with the ironic and powerful frame of mind that distinguishes her. Our bodies have become objects to be monitored, which can be filmed and recorded; our choices, apparently free, reveal our inclination to follow the majority opinion, to opt for what is manufactured by advertising, to accept the colonisation of our minds by the media or influencers.

Two of Maguy Marin's most representative works will be performed in Parma: *Nocturnes* (25 and 26 November, Teatro Due), where the choreographer challenges and charms the spectator with extreme solutions and a creative fantasy composed of small, polite and ironic sketches. A bare stage set is the backdrop for unfinished encounters, seemingly inexplicable gestures, appearances and disappearances of mysterious characters. And *Umwelt* (15 December, Teatro Regio), a 2004 performance that was thrilling and controversial, a "dance without the dance" to narrate the frenzy of life. The performers appear and disappear through the gaps between the panels and mirrors arranged in a row on the stage and, obstructed by a strong wind, narrate, often frantically, the everydayness of living.

On 16 December, the project will end at the Ariosto Theatre in Reggio Emilia with two performances by the MM Contemporary Dance Company directed by choreographer Michele Merola. In *Duo d'Eden*, two dancers play a man and a woman, flesh-coloured jumpsuits highlight their nudity, and she wears a very long hair wig. They represent Adam and Eve immersed in a journey of sensuality, libido, defence, attack, in a world not so peaceful, safe and idyllic. The national preview of *Grosse Fugue*, featuring four women and an extraordinary piece of music as *Die Grosse Fuge* by Ludwig van Beethoven is eagerly awaited. Created in 2001 for the Maguy Marin Company, the national preview will be presented at the Reggio Parma Festival, interpreted by four dancers of the MM Contemporary Dance Company accompanied by the live music of the soloists of the Haydn Orchestra of Bolzano and Trento, in the string quartet version. The national premiere of the piece is scheduled for July 2024 at the Bolzano Dance Festival.



















The film **UMWELT**, **de l'autre côté des miroirs**, directed by David Mambouch, will be screened in the Sala Verdi of the Ariosto Theatre at 4.30 p.m. on 16 December. The film interweaves the two sides of the play of the same name: the frontal plane seen from the theatre hall, and the other, invisible to spectators, on the other side of the mirrors.

The **Può sempre servire** (**It May Always be Useful**) workshop featuring Maguy Marin is a review of the fundamentals of the artist's presence on stage and it will raise many questions on the act of creation. It consists of two weeks of advanced training, exchanges, dialogue addressed to professional dance, theatre and music artists, aimed at setting in motion invention and composition skills with practical and concrete exercises (from 14 to 18 November, from 20 to 24 November 2023 at Teatro Due in Parma, free participation, max. 16 people selected through selection - information and bookings: f.gandini@teatrodue.org - Tel. 0521 282212). This is also the objective of the **round table** scheduled for 25 November in Parma which, with Maguy Marin, and the participation of numerous guests, including Olivier Neveux, professor of history and theatrical aesthetics at the *École normale supérieure* in Lyon.

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I am very pleased to see how the commitment of our members is renewed and strengthened in this new artistic project, on which they have worked together to devise and propose a programme of the highest level. Enhancing the production abilities that are the most precious heritage of the three prominent theatre institutions active in the Emilia region is the primary objective for the Reggio Parma Festival. The "passione dei possibili" (Passion of Possible) arises in the same time as desire and wish, as need for transmission, as participation to shared sensibility, as soil to be ploughed before planting the shoots of creation and caring for them individually and collectively.
